Outcome statement/Te tauāki ā-hua

Strategic Purpose statement/ Te rautaki o te tohu

The purpose of this qualification is to provide the water treatment industry with individuals who can manage the operation of one or more water treatment plants to ensure they are operating at an optimum level and maintaining compliance with regulatory requirements.

The qualification is stranded to recognise the specialist skills required to work in either drinking-water or wastewater treatment plants.

The trainee will benefit from having a qualification within a training pathway that recognises progression through the water industry, as well as increased skill and knowledge acquisition to improve job performance.

Graduates will be capable of working autonomously and may be in a leadership role.

Graduate Profile/Ngā hua o te tohu

Graduates of this qualification will be able to:

• Manage visitors, external contractors, and/or lead staff in a water treatment plant environment.

Graduates of the Drinking-Water strand will also be able to:

- Manage and optimise drinking-water treatment plant operations and ensure compliance with relevant legislation, and current New Zealand drinking-water standards
- Manage risks to public health in a drinking-water treatment plant environment.

Graduates of the Wastewater strand will also be able to:

- Manage and optimise a wastewater treatment plant to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements
- Manage risks in a wastewater treatment plant environment

This qualification can build on the relevant strand of New Zealand Certificate in Water Treatment (Level 4) with strands in Drinking-Water, Wastewater, Drinking-Water Multistage Processes, and Wastewater Multistage Processes [Ref: 2242].

If a relevant strand/s of the New Zealand Certificate in Water Treatment (Level 4) has not been completed, candidates will need to demonstrate equivalent skills and knowledge prior to enrolment in this qualification.
