# TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT (TTM) ASSESSMENT PROCESS

#### PROCESS PURPOSE

To ensure that Connexis registered TTM assessors are aware of, and follow the procedures developed and approved for the assessment of candidates completing TTM assessments.

Further, that the pathways to gaining awards and qualifications through the process of enrolments for the Qualifications/ Micro-credentials are clear and how these fit with the Waka Kotahi, NZ Transport Agency, warrant system.

#### **APPLICATION**

This process is applicable to all TTM assessment including the following Connexis programmes:

- Micro-credential in Traffic Management Operative (Level 3)
  - NZQA Ref # 4413
- Micro-credential in Site Traffic Management Specialist non-practising (Level 3)
  - NZQA Ref # 4414
- New Zealand Certificate in Temporary Traffic Worksite Management (Level 3)
  - NZQA Ref # 4190

#### **PROCESS**

#### **Background:**

Temporary Traffic Management are measures that are put in place while work or activities are carried out that would affect the normal operating conditions of any part of the road corridor (road, footpath or berm). Warrants are a requirement for most TTM roles, Waka Kotahi are responsible for issuing these warrants and maintaining the database. Each warrant is mapped to a Connexis Unit Standard. Below is a list of the Connexis Units mapped to the Waka Kotahi warrant type.

These Unit Standards have been grouped into packages of learning that a trainee would enrol into depending on the warrant they are needing to obtain. A trainee starting from the TMO warrant could not enrol into the full NZC qualification due to the duration of the qualification vs the time it would take to complete all the warrant courses. Instead, these have been broken down into smaller packages of learning.

**Note:** The assessment for US31962 and 31963 will be assessed on the Category of Road associated to the appropriate warrant they are applying for. A trainee may need to undertake additional training and assessment for additional Categories of road to meet the requirements of additional warrants.

#### **Provision:**

Connexis have created assessment resources (Trainee Assessment and Assessor Guide) for each of these Unit Standards, Waka Kotahi have created the Training material. A trainee must attend a training course with a registered Waka Kotahi course provider. A trainee must be assessed by a registered assessor with Connexis who has the appropriate Unit Standard on their scope. The assessor must report the results of the assessments on all occasions.

#### **Enrolment:**

A trainee should be enrolled into the correct programme based on their situation. Please refer to the pathway in Appendix 1 of this document which shows the different entry points for training. When the trainee has completed the Units in the Micro-credential, this will be reported to NZQA and the Micro-credential will appear on the trainee Record of Achievement like a normal NZC. In the case of a trainee attending refresher training because they already hold a warrant, they should still be enrolled into the appropriate Micro-credential and qualification as they will be awarded the new Unit Standards as part of the course. #### Credit Reporting:

Regardless of if a trainee is enrolled into a Micro-credential, NZC or completing the Unit Standards through casual credits (assessment outside of a Connexis Training Agreement) there will be no credit reporting fee charged to the assessor to report the Unit Standards to Connexis, which will then show on a trainees' Record of Achievement with NZQA. Assessors **must report** the completed assessment results within ten days of assessment.

## **Existing Warrant:**

There may be some trainees who will hold an existing warrant from the previous process, who are needing to renew their warrant and gain unit standards in the new system.

Rather than these experienced people needing to start from the beginning, there is a process pathway for these trainees to recognise their existing skills and knowledge.


See Appendix 2 for the different pathway options, depending on which previous warrant the trainee holds.

## NOTE:

- The existing warrant will need to be provided to the assessor with their assessment as evidence, the existing warrant must be current or if expired no more than 12 months expired.
- There is no recognition of previous Unit Standards held by trainees. Trainees with any previous Unit Standards will need to go through the 'Existing Warrant Pathway' (Appendix 2).

# **Existing TC Warrant**

Would complete US 31959 TMO Non-practising.



Existing TC Warrant seen as equivalent Skills and Knowledge for US 31958 TTM Worker.

Does not yet award US 31958.



If practicing, would move on to completing US 31960 TMO Practising.



Once completed US 31960 TMO Practising, assessor can award US 31958 TTM Worker.

# **Existing STMS wanting the STMS non-practising new warrant**

Would complete US 31962 STMS Non-practising.



Assessor can award US 31961 STMS universal and 31959 TMO non-practising.

# **Existing STMS wanting the STMS Practising new warrant**

Will create a combined assessment with the practical tasks for US 31958 TTM Worker, 31960 TMO Practising & 31963 STMS Practising. Until this is created, they can follow the below process.

Would complete US 31962 STMS Non-practising.



Assessor can award US 31959 TMO Non-practising and 31961 STMS Universal.



Would complete US 31960 TMO Practising.



Assessor can award US 31958 TTM Worker.



Would complete US 31963 STMS Practising.
