LINE MECHANIC COMPETITION

To compete in this competition, you must have a team of four people. Three of the team members must be registered line mechanics with current practicing licenses. The fourth team member must be a trainee line mechanic on a Connexis line mechanic training programme pathway or equivalent.

Trainee line mechanics that completed their last block course prior to the competition may still compete as trainees providing, they are not registered with the Electrical Workers Registration Board at the time of the competition.

The competition will work on a rotational basis over three days to ensure there is always activity in the arena for spectators to enjoy. Each team must participate in all events contained in the program. Judging will be based on best industry practices and procedures used across New Zealand and industry guides, regulations, and handbooks.

Please Note:

The new SMEI format will be used from 2022 Competitors must use a full-body harness that complies with AS/NZS 1891.4:2009. Lower body harness/safety belts (i.e. traditional line mechanic belts) will not be permitted.

It is the responsibility of competitors to ensure their PPE, tools, vehicles, and equipment are safe, currently "in test" and appropriate for the tasks they will have to carry out during the competition.

Any equipment found to be faulty or out of test will be removed and the team will incur penalties.

Competitors should ensure they have copies of test certificates available as judges may request evidence for relevant equipment.

CABLE JOINTER COMPETITION

This competition is for individuals. It is open to cable jointers with experience in all aspects of live low voltage and high voltage jointing practices.

Each competitor must participate in a minimum of eight events. Judging will be based on best industry practices and procedures used across New Zealand and industry guides, regulations, and handbooks. These include but are not limited to:

- The Line Mechanics and Cable Jointers handbook
 6th edition 2013
- Safety Manual Electricity Industry (SM-EI), Parts 1, 2 & 3 July 2015
- Cable Construction Unit Standard 20074;
- Electricity (Safety) regulations 2010 (Reprint as at 4 April 2016)
- New Zealand First Aid Handbook, 2009, Order of St John.

Please Note:

The new SMEI format will be used from 2022 Competitors must bring with them basic test instruments, including an insulation tester, multimeter, independent earth tester, a gas bottle (with regulator and correct compression hose fittings) and gun, torque wrench and all other tools, equipment, and PPE. It is the responsibility of competitors to ensure their PPE, tools and equipment are safe and currently "in test".

Competitors with faulty or out of test PPE, tools or equipment will not be allowed to compete. Competitors should ensure they have copies of test certificates available as judges may request evidence.
